During transition, Lydia: "I think we're going to snack and craft time now." Girl: "But we really came here to learn about Jesus."

Revealing: How pop culture influences kids' view of spiritual things. (from a conversation Harrison had with a child) What kids talk about that they do at home. Many children have very few filters in place when it comes to media and entertainment.

Life Awareness: our theme, Kids Under Construction gave our churches some great ideas for construction themed crafts!
